## A LETTER FROM OUR CHURCHWARDEN AND LAY ELDER

Dear All

Last month Revd. Deirdre Parmenter wrote about how the benefice was working together to find a new Priest-in-Charge and finished with the Orebeck prayer, which was written to accompany the 2019 Palm Sunday Pilgrimage and has been used regularly since then.

We have been a benefice since 2017, although the churches were already working together before that and our normal service pattern means that we worship together as a benefice on the first (and fifth) Sundays of the month in each of our seven churches in rotation.

Talking to people in our villages, some seem to worry that having the Orebeck benefice threatens the individuality of our villages. It doesn't! The benefice is a sort of umbrella for the churches in our seven villages because we share one post for a Priest-in-Charge.

None of our parishes can afford a priest of their own so the only way we can have an incumbent is to share one. The annual cost of a priest is about £68,800. That is not what they earn! The cost includes salaries, training, pensions, housing and other administrative costs. Even between all the seven parishes we cannot afford a full-time priest so will be looking for a part time post of four or five days a week (including Sundays, of course).

To advertise the post, all the parishes have submitted a profile of their church and village and this has been amalgamated with what we would like to see in the future, general details of the area, the Diocese etc. The next step is for the Archdeacon and Bishops to approve the application and then it will be advertised.

Recently the editor of the magazine for Campsea Ashe, Hacheston, Marlesford and Parham moved away and the person taking over the Brandeston and Kettleburgh magazine (Jan Baldwin) agreed to take on the other four parishes. That meant that Easton was the only parish not included and we felt that was wrong. For the rest of the year Easton will have its current magazine and a page in the benefice magazine. After that there may well be a village newsletter. We hope you have already seen a copy of the benefice magazine which started in July.





## SUFFOLK HIGHWAYS NOTICE – ROADWORKS & CLOSURES

### TO INSTALL TRAFFIC CALMING – 1<sup>ST</sup> AUGUST 2022

We are writing to inform you of our plans to install traffic calming measures at various sections of the roads detailed below. This scheme is being delivered using funding received by Easton Parish Council, from the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). The work will involve new road markings being installed, new gateway signs which have been supplied by Easton Parish Council and traffic calming buildouts within the highway.

**Phase 1** - C239 The Street, Easton (Framlingham Road to School Lane)

**Phase 2** - C237 Framlingham Road, Easton (from Kettleburgh Road for approx. 240m northbound)

**Diversion route for phases 1 & 2** – Wickham Market Road, Easton Road, Hacheston, B1116, Easton Road, Framlingham, Dark Lane, Framlingham Road, Easton and vice versa.

**Phase 3** - C235 Kettleburgh Road, Easton (from Framlingham Road for approximately 440m northwest bound)

**Diversion route for phase 3** – Framlingham Road, Easton, Dark Lane, Easton Road, Framlingham, B1116, Kettleburgh Road, Framlingham, Framlingham Road, Kettleburgh, School Hill, Road from B1116 to C235, The Street, Kettleburgh, Easton Road, Kettleburgh, Kettleburgh Road, Easton and vice versa.

**Phase 4** - C302 Sanctuary Bridge Road, Easton – From the junction with The Street to the junction with Hall Road.

**Diversion route for Phase 4** – Hall road, Cooks Hill, Park Road, B1078, B1116, Easton Road, Hacheston, Wickham Market Road, The Street and vice versa.

The works are programmed to start on 1 August 2022 and will continue for two weeks, excluding the weekends. The roads will be closed in phases to ensure the safety of our workforce and road users.

Pedestrian and vehicular access to properties will be available; however, there may be a short delay to enable our teams to make the area safe.

As we plan roadworks in advance, we schedule extra days to allow for bad weather or other delays beyond our control. If we need to make major changes to our work dates, we will update the information signs on site.

A plan showing the diversion route for these works is attached to this email. When we close the road and put a diversion in place, the route needs to be accessible to vehicles of all shapes and sizes. We make our diversions as clear as possible by placing appropriate signing along the route. The latest updates on our works can be found on our website at "[Temporary road closures for Suffolk Highways roadworks](#)" and on [One.Network](#) website.

## Understanding Cookies

Avast recently carried out research which found that more than four in five people (85%) have accepted cookies on a website without reading any of the policies, while more than a third (37%) said they've done so, only to later discover they had agreed to something they wish they hadn't.

1. The first step to navigating digital cookies is understanding what exactly they are. Cookies are like identification cards made up of small bits of information in the form of text that help computers interact with websites. On the one hand, they allow websites to remember information, such as logins or items stored in an online shopping cart. On the other hand, they can record your browsing activity so advertisers can use it for targeted advertising.
2. If you want to limit the information websites can access, choose a browser that blocks third-party cookies (those created by websites other than the one you're visiting) by default.
3. It's good digital hygiene to clear cookies regularly. You can do so in the settings or preferences of your browser of choice. Deleting cookies helps to keep your browser running smoothly.
4. Some websites allow you to control what cookies to accept or reject via a pop-up window that appears before you access them. It is good practice to only accept the cookies required for websites to function, such as language and region, and reject those related to advertising and tracking.
5. For more privacy-conscious people, consider rejecting all cookies but expect website performance issues. Alternatively, choose a secure browser with anti-tracking technology to block web trackers, including cookies, to minimise companies' amount of online surveillance.

## TRADING STANDARDS SUFFOLK

Fraudsters continue to rely on the fact that many people are buying online. They want access to your money and information, or for you to click on links which could download malware to your device. Instead of clicking the link, log into your account directly to update or check your information. If you receive a scam text message, report it by forwarding it to 7726. If you think you might have responded to a text message or email scam and provided your bank account details, contact your bank immediately.

A resident has reported receiving an email supposedly from the Driver and Vehicle licencing Agency advising that their car is no longer taxed. The document is well presented and does of course ask for payment details. In addition to payment details it also requests date of birth and mother's maiden name — all important information for fraudsters. Our resident wisely did not reply to it.
