If you could pass any law you would ...


Ban talking on mobiles phones on public transport and in restaurants—I don't need to hear other people's conversations thank you.

Fake RSPCA Websites Advertising Premium Rate Numbers

The Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (RSPCA) is warning the public about rogue websites advertising fake premium rate numbers for their cruelty line.

The premium rate 0844 numbers advertised are designed to rack up a heavy bill for the caller and give a false impression that they're affiliated with the charity.

The RSPCA said when a member of the public dials the fake number they'll be charged a premium rate and are then diverted to their National Control Centre. This means the caller may not be immediately aware of the scam. The charity conducted a search on Google and found 8 different scam sites with the incorrect 0844 premium rate numbers in the first 10 pages of Google..

The correct number to report 24-hour cruelty to the RSPCA is **0300 1234 999**. The call will cost the same as any call to a UK landline number.

Cold Calls From Bogus Bailiffs

There has been an increase in cold calls to the public from bogus bailiffs requesting payments for a "phantom" debt.

The fraud involves being cold-called by someone purporting to be a bailiff working on behalf of a court, attempting to recover funds for a non-existent debt.

Fraudsters are requesting payment by bank transfer and if refused they threaten to visit the people's homes or place work in order to recover the debt that is owed. From the reports received a range of different businesses and individuals are being targeted.

Key facts about bailiffs

A bailiff is someone who has a legal power to collect certain debts. They may do this by asking you to pay what you owe, or by taking and selling your belongings to raise the money.

Bailiffs are only used to recover certain debts such as council tax, child support and compensation orders. Bailiffs are not used to recover debts relating to private advertisement; these would be collected by debt collectors.

Debt collectors do not have the same legal powers as bailiffs and will not have special court authorisation to act. If you're not sure whether you're dealing with a bailiff or a debt collector, check with Citizens Advice.

How to protect yourself

- Make vigorous checks if you ever get a cold call associated with a bailiff.
- If you work for a business and receive a call or visit from bailiffs or debt collectors, be sure to speak with your manager or business owner first. Never pay the debts yourself on behalf of the business you work for; some fraudsters have suggested employees do this whilst talking with them, suggesting they can then be reimbursed by their employer, when in reality the debt is non-existent.
- Request details of the debt in writing to confirm its legitimacy. Do not feel rushed or intimidated to make a decision based on a phone call.

FIND is a Christian based charity that was founded in 1990 to provide emergency assistance to families or individuals affected by poverty or dispossession. FIND is also able to offer ongoing friendship and support to those in need. FIND befriends people without judging them, offers advice when required and gives support for as long as it is needed.

WHO DOES FIND HELP? Anyone living within 25 miles radius of Ipswich who is deprived of a minimum standard of living, be they single, families, lone parents, children, elderly, sick or disabled.

WHAT DOES FIND OFFER? The charity provides, free of charge: food; cooking utensils; clothing, toiletries; baby equipment and nappies; bedding; survival sleeping bags; curtains and furniture; white goods; Christmas hampers and gifts, etc.

WHO PROVIDES THE RESOURCES? Financial and practical support and basic essentials are provided by various organisations, clubs, charities and individuals.

WHO DELIVERS THE HELP? The charity is managed and run by a small team of committed volunteers, some of whom have been helped by FIND in the past. Food and equipment is regularly delivered by volunteer drivers and helpers; larger goods are transported in the charity's own van.

WHAT DOES FIND NEED?

- Schools and churches to collect foodstuffs and non-perishable goods. Regular drivers and helpers to assist on the van and at Christmas time. Anyone able to organise or assist with fund raising activities.
- A clean, dry storage area for preparation of Christmas hampers and gifts.
- Financial assistance.
- Items of houseware, eg: beds, sofas, chests of drawers, etc. (Items must comply with safety regulations).
