Reverend Graham Hedger's Letter

In 1983 I was ordained deacon in St Edmundsbury Cathedral on the feast of St Thomas. I've always had a soft spot for that particular disciple. Over the years he's earned the name 'doubting Thomas', which I feel is slightly unfair. He is the one who for some reason was absent when Jesus made an appearance to the disciples on Easter Day. Seeing they believed. He came back and hearing their story was still sceptical and said, 'Unless I see the scars of the nails in his hands and put my finger on those scars and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

A week later he was present when Jesus appeared to his disciples and Jesus said to him, 'stop your doubting and believe'. It sounds simple. But Thomas can be seen as a modern day disciple, questioning, searching and seeking a level of understanding to strengthen his faith.

In his book 'Chosen', Giles Fraser recounts some of the turmoil he went through when in 2011 the Occupy movement set up camp near St Paul's Cathedral in London. Eventually a decision was taken to evict them. This prompted him to resign from his position as Canon Chancellor of the Cathedral and set in train a series of events that led to him rediscovering his Jewish roots. It is a profound book which shows the value of questioning and searching after truth and ends on a positive note. After a period of doubt, questioning and searching, he could arrive at a point of hope, affirming his roots and being ready to move forward.

Jesus' words to Thomas were 'Do you believe because you see me? How happy are those who believe without seeing me!'. Words for us in 2021.

Services—A message from Graham



How time flies when you're having fun! We are gradually coming to the end of this academic year and are trying hard to continue with our traditional end of term activities. We have had a few outdoor assemblies where we were able to sing! We plan to have a sports day during the day and there are planned educational visits for each class, including a week of exciting outings for the end of primary school for our year six pupils. We have also been treated to an afternoon of talent with Easton's Got Talent and we certainly do have talent here!

Hazel Class (R/year 1) have been busy working on their latest maths mission. They are planning a trip to the seaside and using maths skills to work out the cost, the group size, the coach and how much the chips cost! In D&T they have been designing their boats ready to make them and take them to Aldeburgh to float on the boating lake. For our Big Think the children were given the task of building a Viking longship. Oak Class (years 4, 5 and 6) have been planting up in the 'Triangle of life' for National Gardening for Mental Health week. National Fraud Intelligence Bureau News

Stay ahead of the fraudsters – emerging issues to look out for:

- **Festival/concert ticketing fraud**

There has been a huge demand for tickets to the festivals and concerts that have now been announced. Fraudsters are expected to try and take advantage of this demand over the coming months.

- **Holiday fraud**

Following the government's announcement that some international travel can resume, low cost private testing systems offering Covid testing for holidaymakers are likely to be overwhelmed by the sheer demand. Fraudsters may look to take advantage of this demand by purporting to offer reasonably priced tests to holidaymakers.

- **Post-vaccine survey scams**

People are being contacted via email and/or text message after receiving the COVID19 vaccine to participate in a fraudulent post-vaccine survey with the promise of a prize or cash at the end. Their credit card information is requested, and they are charged for the shipping and handling fees, but never receive the promised prize. Although the victims appear to be based in the US at present, it is likely that this sort of fraud will be attempted in the UK.

- **End of furlough schemes**

It is highly likely that, following the end of the furlough scheme in September, there will be an increase in demand for short term loans. Fraudsters are likely to try and exploit this demand leading to a potential increase in the volume of cold calls from companies purporting to offer various loans to individuals struggling financially.



- **Advance fee fraud**

This is when fraudsters target victims to make advance or upfront payments for goods, services and/or financial gains that do not materialise. It is likely that career opportunities may be offered for payment of an upfront fee for jobs that do not exist.

No to uninvited traders

There has been a lot in the media regarding people cold calling and selling goods or services on the doorstep. In many cases this is unwanted. I have a number of stickers which are available to put on your door/window to deter these type of callers. A copy of the label is shown below. After the Sale of the Easton Estate in 1922

Lady Jean Fforde (Part 1)

“The old were young once.”



My Recollections – by Brian Boon

My interest in the 92+year tenure of the Dukes of Hamilton and their ownership of 4,833 acres of their Easton Park Estate, commenced when Sue and I purchased a semi-detached ex-agricultural cottage in School Lane, Easton, on 16th August 2007.

The first Conveyance document in the bundle of Deeds was dated 1922, was beautifully hand-scripted and related to the sale of the property in 1922 by “The Most Honourable Mary Louise Graham, commonly called the Marchioness of Graham.”

(Mary was the only daughter of the 12th Duke of Hamilton and inherited the Easton and Glemham Estates from her father on his death in 1895, together with Brodick Castle in Scotland and the greater part of the Isle of Arran.)

The document contained many red wax seals and signatures from both Mary and other titled landowners in Scotland, such as Robert Cameron of Achnacarry Castle, Inverness.

Such was the start of my interest in the history of this conservation village it lead to Sue and I visiting Arran, Brodick and later the Royal Northern & Clyde Yacht Club in search of more information, eventually amassing a wealth of historical information, documents, maps and images which has been made available to the village and kept our history alive.



I learned of Lady Jean whilst visiting Brodick and Arran in 2011 and subsequently corresponded with her through her Personal Private Secretary whenever I discovered images, photographs or information that I thought she might appreciate.

One such item, in particular, was when I was informed that a distant relative, Richard Pipe, who worked as a Gamekeeper for the 12th Duke, had kept a diary throughout his life. On his death, his diary was handed to Ronald Blythe, author of Akenfield. That diary was subsequently published by Ronald Blythe as one chapter in his book "The View in Winter - Reflections on Old Age". The chapter is entitled "A Glimpse of the Duke, the Gamekeeper".

I forwarded a copy to Lady Jean and received a written reply from her personally. She mentioned that she was only 3 years of age when the estate was sold so she did not know anything about it. However, she had placed it in a file with other Easton things in it.

She also mentioned that her mother, (Mary) had possessed a copy of the 1919 Sale Catalogue, which she loved dearly, together with a few watercolour paintings of places around the estate.

Lady Jean also sent me a personal copy of the audio DVD, "Castles to Catastrophes", she made for her Grandson, detailing her life and experiences. It is recorded in her own voice and is a verbal account of her life from mixing with European Royalty and adapting to life after the sales of their estates and other properties to settle the debts of her grandfather resulting in Brodick being passed to the National Trust for Scotland and how she was dealt with by the Estate Trustees and the Trust.

The DVD is a copy of the two books she wrote, "Castles in the Air" and "Feet on the Ground". Both books can be found on the internet in paperback form. The original hard cover versions are now out of print and signed copies being quoted in the vicinity of £85. I am fortunate to have possession of an original version of "Castles in the Air" containing her signature.

A remarkable individual.
