


### New to the Village?








## BT Direct Debit Email Scam

The email begins with 'Avoid missing payments' to get your attention. It then goes on to say, 'We wanted to let you know that your direct debit with us is no longer active. This means you don't currently have an automatic payment method set up to deal with your bills.' Underneath this statement there's a link that directs you to a fake website to set up a new direct debit - this is where your personal and financial details will be taken, so don't click on this. Extra pressure is added with the threat of being 'charged a late payment fee' if you don't click on the link.

The email has BT's recognisable branding, using its colour scheme and logo. It uses BT's genuine phone number and address, as well as links to the company's online scam advice, privacy policy and terms and conditions - a bold move from the scammers, and one that makes it even more difficult to spot the scam.

We shared this scam email with BT and a spokesperson said: 'We advise our customers to remain vigilant against potential scams, especially phishing emails. If you are suspicious or uncomfortable with an email appearing to be from BT, please contact our customer service team for support.'

## Beware of BP fuel card scams circulating on Facebook

Scammers are promoting fake BP fuel card offers to steal your details. A scam Facebook advert impersonating BP claims to give you the chance of receiving 200 litres of fuel for just £1.78. Rising fuel costs are on the radar of scammers, inspiring them to create new ways of tempting you to part with your money.

The scam Facebook advert appears as 'Discounts on 200 fuel litre cards', It uses an image of a crowded BP petrol station with a hand holding a BP fuel card. The text above the image states: 'BP is leaving Russia and redirecting leftover fuel to the

UK, giving you the chance to get a 200 litre fuel card for just £1.78.' It claims that you could win this fuel by following a link to a website to complete a survey - tricking victims into handing their details over to these scammers.

Another version of the scam sees the same image under the text: 'Due to the current rise in fuel prices, BP is running a promotion for its customers, allowing them to get a 200 litre fuel card for £1.78.' Underneath the image, a button labelled 'Order Now' leads to a dodgy website designed to take your details. When the link in this particular scam ad is clicked on, you're sent to a website that uses the BP logo and says: 'Congratulations! You have been selected to participate in the BP promotion! The government in cooperation with "BP" announced the distribution of fuel cards on 200 litres at £1.78 to the British.'

It then asks three questions:

Are you from the United Kingdom?

How much gasoline do you use per month?

Do you use BP gas stations?

Once these are answered, you're given three attempts to choose the 'correct box' with the fake fuel card prize in it from 12 on-screen gift boxes. If the correct box is selected, you're taken to a page that offers you the non-existent fuel card for £1.78 and asks for your personal details.

## Easton's History

I have had several appreciative comments in relation to my article about not knowing my paternal grandparents, but being able to trace where they lived in the village through the Estate Sale catalogue in 1919.

The photograph below shows William Frederick Boon driving Easton School on a coach outing. He was employed on the Estate as a Horseman.

I think their photograph overleaf gives a wonderful picture of years ago. My grandfather, William Frederick Boon, was an agricultural worker on the estate, moving into the right-hand side of Low Barn Cottages when he retired. They are obviously dressed in their Sunday Best. My grandmother's maiden name was Ellen Eliza Barber. They married at Pettistree Church on the 16<sup>th</sup> October 1880.

What a wonderful presentation of how people lived over 100 years ago. They managed to bring up eleven children. All would not have been in their house at the same time. Girls would go into service in the mansion. The full page photo opposite clarifies the fine details.

## DR DAN POULTER MP

Member of Parliament for Central Suffolk and North Ipswich

This year, the State Opening of Parliament saw HRH the Prince of Wales deliver HM the Queen's speech for the first time, due to concerns around HM the Queen's health. The State Opening marks the beginning of a new Parliamentary session and the Queen's Speech set out 38 new Bills which will help the Government to continue delivering on its top priorities.

Amidst those new Bills is the Levelling Up and Regeneration Bill, which will deliver planning reforms, regenerate towns and cities and shift powers down from central Government to local leaders, giving communities a louder voice and empowering them to shape their own futures.

Whilst I welcomed earlier plans to reshape planning policy, the one size approach proposed was not appropriate for Suffolk and I was very pleased to have played my part in delivering a rethink on that earlier White Paper. So, whilst the devil lies in the detail and I await full sight of the detail in the new proposed planning reforms, I am pleased that the voice of local communities will be heard as part of the new reforms. I have always taken the view that any development should be appropriate, protecting our greenbelt land wherever possible and retaining the fabric, heritage and character of our rural villages and small towns here in Suffolk. It is vital that any development should be delivered through a truly locally led planning system and communities should retain the right to shape the areas in which they live, something which this new Bill should help to enshrine in law.

I have also written recently about how rising energy costs caused by the conflict in Ukraine have reinforced the need to improve Britain's energy security. We have finally realised the importance of being less reliant upon foreign supplies for our energy and the need to improve our own energy security. The sustainable answer to securing our energy and fuel needs must come through investment in carbon neutral and renewable sources, so I welcome the proposed Energy Security Bill which will ultimately deliver a more secure, homegrown, and cheaper energy network for all of us.

I was delighted to welcome the Education Secretary, the Rt. Hon. Nadhim Zahawi, to Stradbroke where he met with Head Teachers from schools across Central Suffolk and North Ipswich. He spoke to them about his aspirations for driving up standards for all children and the increased funding which has been secured via the Schools Bill. I have long been pushing for more money for our schools here in Suffolk and very much welcome this additional investment which will help to drive up standards and help our children catch up on lost learning during the past two years.

Finally, I particularly welcome the new Mental Health Bill and hope to be able to use my own knowledge and experience as a mental health doctor to be part of the early scrutiny process in shaping this Bill, so that sensible and appropriate changes can be made to ensure that it better benefits and meets the needs of patients here in Suffolk.

## Letheringham Notes

On June 6<sup>th</sup> in Easton Farm Park's Riverside Café, historian Nicky Reynolds gave an informative and entertaining Monday Mardle entitled Soil Cinderellas on the often overlooked contribution that the Women's Land Army made to the war effort in both the First & Second World Wars in East Anglia. The Mardle was very well attended and raised some £355 towards the Church restoration fund. Our Thanks to Nicky for the delightful presentation and to Fiona Siddall for allowing us to use the Riverside Café.

Wednesday evening's 15<sup>th</sup> June Evensong Service, was the first service to be held by our new priest-in-charge Revd Gary Best and we hope that with his leadership and our help we can help rebuild St Mary's congregation.


