## **Reverend Graham Hedger's Letter**

November is here. The season of remembrance draws together thanksgiving for saints, for all the faithful departed, and the sacrifice of many to preserve peace. It is a time when our thoughts go back to those who have come before us. We remember those who have influenced us, loved us, cared for us and who are no longer with us.

When I was young my granddad used to take me for a walk, and we would always end up throwing a stone into the pond and watching the ripples grow outwards. In life we never know the effect of what we do and say. Several years ago, I attended an extraordinary funeral. The church was packed with people of all ages and the service was a tremendous celebration of the Christian faith. Although the person who had died was only 24, the ripples of his life had touched many people.

He was one of God's special people who had a special way with him. Simple acts of kindness that showed his love of God. Whether it was taking flowers to someone who was sad, or talking to people whom the world ignored. During the service people were asked to write their special memories on a piece of paper for inclusion in a book. A few weeks after the funeral I had the privilege of reading that book. It was incredibly moving as it showed just how many people had been affected by his short life.

We may never know what ripples from our lives affect others, but we can be thankful for all of those who by what they have said and done have made a difference to our life. Perhaps today you will find the time to think back through your life and remember someone who has made a difference to you for the better and give thanks for them.

### **All Souls Day 2<sup>nd</sup> November**

This is a special day, when we have the opportunity to give thanks for loved ones who are no longer with us. This year the service will be at Easton at 6pm. It is a simple reflective service. During the service people are invited to bring a name card and place it by a candle as a simple act of remembrance.

### **Remembrance Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> November**

There will be services in many of our churches on Remembrance Sunday, offering the opportunity to give thanks for those who have given their lives that we might have peace and freedom.

## Covid-safe Church Services

From July 19<sup>th</sup> government regulations have become guidance.

The way we organise our services in church is based upon national guidance. Our aim is to make them as safe as possible with everyone taking responsibility for themselves and showing compassion and courtesy to others. As with all things Covid the process will be kept under review.

We are adopting a uniform approach across the benefice.

- Regular risk assessments are carried out in each church.
- Where churches have side doors and windows these will be open for ventilation.
- We recognise that some people will feel more vulnerable now than previously and may want to sit on their own or wear a mask at all times. In view of this we invite all people to wear a face covering and to continue to socially distance. For most Sunday services this does not present a problem!
- We ask people to use hand sanitiser as they come in and go out of church.
- At Holy Communion, face coverings to be worn when moving around the church.
- The priest will wear a mask when administering Communion.
- Communion will continue in one kind (bread, no wine).
- We recommence congregational singing in church.

For baptisms, weddings and funerals:

The government has lifted restrictions on numbers attending weddings, funerals and baptisms. In discussion with the families, we will decide whether to limit numbers. If numbers are not limited, then social distancing may not be possible. We ask all people to wear face coverings.

## Campsea Ashe Christian Book Circle

A few of us from the village got together over a coffee recently and began to enthuse over a new book about Jesus's Sermon on the Mount - *Following the Call: Living the*



*Sermon on the Mount Together.* It's a collection of writings from a wide spectrum of Christian traditions from Roman Catholic to Anabaptist, including Thomas Merton, Mother Teresa, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, C.S Lewis, N.T. Wright, Dr Martin Luther King Jr. and Eberhard Arnold. It's available from Amazon at £13.92 (you can read the first few chapters on-line for free) or download the whole book on Kindle for £4.79. The book is designed to be explored and discussed in small group settings so we decided to set one up!

Whatever Christian tradition you favour, or indeed if you are not a Christian but would like to explore the teachings of Jesus with us, you would be most welcome. Similarly, you don't have to be a resident of Campsea Ashe, other villages are welcome to join the circle too! We plan to meet fortnightly, starting on **Thursday November 11th 2021** at 7.30pm at **The Station House in Campsea Ashe**. Tea and coffee will be provided. We would love to see you there. What form the Book Circle takes over coming months and how frequently we meet depends on the wishes of those who attend so do come along and have your say. ## Easton's History – The Estate Sales

The first sale of Easton Park Estate of 4,833 acres, including the Mansion [the home of the Duke and Duchess of Hamilton which stood behind the wall in the village, now demolished], took place on Tuesday 29th April 1919 at The Crown & Anchor Hotel in Ipswich. The Mansion failed to sell at that sale, together with three 'productive farms', arable and pasture accommodation lands, twenty-three Cottages with gardens, plus the advowson or perpetual right of presentation to the Rectory of Easton.

The second sale of property and items remaining also took place at The Crown & Anchor Hotel, Ipswich on 29<sup>th</sup> June 1922. Expressly excluded from both sales were the oak panelling in the Duchess of Hamilton's bedroom, the oak chimney piece in her boudoir, and the chimney piece in the dining room. These items were removed on the 24<sup>th</sup> June and any damage done was made good both to the structure and decoration.

The items removed were taken to their Brodick Castle home, together with the refectory table and bench from Letheringham Abbey. They can be seen in the dining room at Brodick Castle. A full colour picture of the dining room is on the next page.

I do have the auction catalogues from both the 1919 and 1929 sales. The 1919 catalogue is marked with the names of most of the purchasers, together with the individual sales prices. Houses also list the then current occupier, together with brief details of each property. For example, our property in School Lane was part of Lot 64, which also included the house next door and two areas of land opposite described as another garden and a productive orchard. Purchased by a Mr Fison for £300.

Brodict Castle Dining Room showing the oak panels on the wall, plus the items from Letheringham Abbey



Brodict was handed to the National Trust for Scotland by The Marchioness of Graham, neé Lady Mary Hamilton, in lieu of death duties. The castle was handed over complete with all of its contents, the most complete property ever received by the Trust. If visiting, mention you come from Easton and they will be very interested.

**DR DAN POULTER MP**

Member of Parliament for Central Suffolk and North Ipswich

**October 2021**

We are incredibly lucky to live in a rural county like Suffolk, largely protected from overdevelopment, but one of the biggest issues that people ask me about is the planning system. Whilst we all accept that we need to build more homes for local people and for our children and grandchildren, it is essential that any new homes are built in the right place and with the right infrastructure.

It is for these reasons that I helped to lead the successful campaign to stop the Ipswich Northern Bypass. Right from the start, it always seemed to me that the bypass was more about mass house building than about relieving any travel and congestion issues in Ipswich, and that is why so many people, like me, fought against it.

Any new housing should, in general, be on a small scale and incremental. The planning system needs to protect our precious countryside wherever possible and retain the fabric, character and heritage of our villages and towns. I have made it clear to Government ministers that any decisions around new homes and where they should be located, is a matter which must be decided locally, in full consultation with residents, parish and local councils. New homes should be delivered through a locally led planning system. Communities should retain the right to shape the areas in which they live and to be able to demand health and educational infrastructure to support any new housing.

So, I am pleased to report that working alongside a number of other MPs, I have succeeded in delivering a rethink on the recent Government Planning White Paper. The White Paper would have set national targets for house building, made it much easier for developers to build houses and would have circumvented the local planning process. For me, this would have been wrong. It is essential that planning rules are set locally, not according to national targets, and I am pleased to have played my part in ensuring that this will continue to be the case.

Later this year, the Government will firmly set out new planning laws in its Planning Bill and I am confident that these laws will deliver a planning system that is locally led and fit for the future. With COP26 upon us, it is essential that due consideration is also given to the environment and I would also like to see a planning system that delivers high quality, low carbon design, helping to ensure cost effective, energy efficient homes, so that we continue to play our world-leading role in tackling climate change.

# EASTON PRIMARY SCHOOL



As we come to the end of the first half term, we have had a very busy month with lots of learning taking place, tournaments and educational visits. The school is looking fab with new displays going up. We have had a lot of new starter visits for next year and have had some lovely comments saying how nice the school looks.

The school would like to thank the ESA for organising this event and the Cricket Club for once again allowing us to hold the event there.

Hazel Class (Reception and Year 1) continued their topic on castles and had a lovely visit to Framlingham castle. They had learnt a lot about castles and happily shared this with our tour guide. They enjoyed being up high and seeing the sights of Framlingham. They have also been learning about the changes in seasons and have enjoyed watching the changes as we head into autumn. They are certainly enjoying the new class layout and trying out some of the activities provided. It's a very busy classroom!

Rowan Class (Years 2 and 3) had a visit to Snape Maltings, working with Suffolk Wildlife Trust and The Lettering and Commemorative Arts Trust. They were given a tour of the gallery finding out about endangered animals in the UK and then visited the local nature reserve to gather interesting pieces for their artwork back in school for a workshop. Rowan Class children have produced some wonderful homework this week. So many ways to show the earth as a 3D structure!

Oak Class (Years 4, 5 and 6) had a visit from Dr Dan Poulter to help them with the school parliament that we run at school. They enjoyed the visit and asked lots of good questions. This was followed by our first school parliament for this year and even the youngest children had an opinion on our agenda.

There has been some amazing Big Think homework coming in from Oak Class as well. The children presented their own work and talked about how they made it and what they have learnt. Their presentations were about the Aztecs and the floating Islands.

Children in KS2 continue to enjoy learning to play the flute. They also have the opportunity to have piano lessons in school. Singing assemblies have started again and it is wonderful to hear singing and music in school at last!

If you have any expertise in any areas of the curriculum we would love to hear from you, we always welcome visitors to the school as part of our enrichment programme. We would particularly like to hear from you if you play an instrument and would play to the children in an assembly (just a one off, so no commitment needed). I know you're out there!

So, with a week for the half term holiday now, the teachers will begin preparing for the second half of the autumn term and, dare I say it ... Christmas!

## News from Suffolk Trading Standards

### Bogus Callers: Scam Energy Sellers

With energy price hikes hitting the news, we are warning households to be alert to bogus energy sales people.

Fraudsters are experts at using the latest headlines to give themselves credibility. The news that the price of gas has soared in recent weeks and the problems with electricity suppliers creates a window of opportunity for scammers to con unsuspecting customers into handing over their bank details. Fraudsters could attempt to cold call households pretending to be well known energy suppliers. The scammers will then attempt to convince consumers to 'switch' supplier and, if they agree, ask for their bank details.

Other risks include face-to-face 'sales people' knocking on doors and pretending they are there to help customers switch providers and, again, taking bank details.

#### PROTECT YOURSELF:

- ! Don't respond to any cold calls
- ! Don't give out your bank details or your personal details
- ! Don't click on links in emails. Check the email address it has come from.

### Vishing: Spot the signs

Vishing is a type of phishing scam that happens on the phone. The word vishing is a combination of 'voice' and 'phishing'.



How to spot a vishing scam:

- ! You receive a call requesting your personal/financial info
- ! The caller claims to be from a trusted organisation
- ! The caller puts the pressure on, trying to make you panic

Remember - It is always okay to reject, refuse or ignore requests. So here is what to do when you receive a call that may come out of the blue with a request for your personal or financial information:

**STOP :**

Only give out your personal or financial information to services you have consented to and are expecting to be contacted by.

**CHALLENGE:**

Could it be fake? Don't give anyone remote access to your computer following a cold call. It's okay to say 'no'

**PROTECT:**

If you think you've fallen for a scam by transferring money to another account for 'safe-keeping' or purchased high value goods/ vouchers to cover the cost of fines, contact your bank immediately and report it to us via Citizens Advice Consumer Service on 0808 223 1133.


