

# From Revd Graham Hedger



'Come you thankful people come,  
Raise the song of harvest home.  
All is safely gathered in,  
'Ere the winter storms begin.'

Over the past few weeks we have all heard the rumble of combines as they move effortlessly up and down the fields round the villages. And as sure as night follows day, harvest festival services follow on from harvest time. As a youngster it was one of my favourite times in church. On Friday evening a large tiered staging was erected in front of the pulpit, it would then be covered in green artificial grass and, as if by magic, by Sunday it would be covered with flowers, fruit and vegetables, most of which were produce of peoples' gardens and allotments. The harvest festival services were great fun and followed on the Monday evening by a bangers and mash harvest supper and auction. The Boys' Brigade were responsible for transporting all the produce from the church to the School Room and then running the items around the room to the successful bidder.

Harvest festivals are the opportunity for us to give thanks to God for the bounty of creation, the hard work of the farmers and food producers. It is also an opportunity to think about the created order, our part in it, and also the many millions of people who survive on very little. Many people support Christian development charities such as TEAR Fund and Christian Aid which work in partnership with local church to enable health, education, community development and agriculture projects to change lives. In this diocese, we have developed the link with Kagera Diocese in NW Tanzania. Recently Bishop Martin has been there to see for himself the work that has been enabled through the Lent Appeal last year. No doubt on his return we will hear a lot more about his visit.

The hymn I quoted at the beginning, reminds us that behind all the technology, it is God who provides and also that we have a personal responsibility for how we live. I invite you to come along to the harvest festival service in your village. Sing the well known hymns, give thanks for the harvest and support those in other parts of the world who still lack food.

# NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH



## Be Aware

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has received intelligence to suggest that fraudsters are contacting social media influencers based in the UK and abroad, offering them the opportunity to market a bogus product, service or investment opportunity.

Fraudsters present professional and credible pitches to the social media influencers and try to convince them to feature the opportunity for a fee on their social media profiles in order to entice unsuspecting followers of the influencer to sign up or make a purchase.

Additionally, fraudsters are using the names of well-known public figures\*, implying that their opportunity or product is endorsed by the figure when it is not. The public should be aware that any apparent endorsement by celebrities, influencers or personalities does not necessarily mean that an investment, product or service is genuine. The public is urged to exercise a cautious approach to any such offer of investment, product or service with the same caution they would at any other time.

## What You Need To Do

If you are purchasing goods from a company you don't know and trust, carry out some research first, or ask friends or family for advice before completing a purchase.

Professional-looking websites, adverts or social media posts do not guarantee that an investment opportunity or product is genuine. Criminals can exploit the names of well-known brands or individuals to make them appear legitimate.

Avoid paying for goods or services by bank transfer unless you know and trust the person or company. Payments via bank transfer offer you no protection if you become a victim of fraud. Instead, use your credit card or payment services such as PayPal as they offer you greater protection if you become a victim of fraud.

*\*A recent example of the use of celebrities is that of Deborah Meaden and Peter Jones from Dragons Den who have falsely been linked with a Bitcoin scam.*

**As we approach autumn many of us are thinking of topping up with heating oil. Some advice from Suffolk Police:**

### Fuel Oil Theft

Despite the cost of heating oil coming down in price it is still a popular target for thieves. Oil tanks are usually hidden from view, which is perfect for thieves.

By following a few simple steps, you can reduce the chance of becoming a victim of fuel oil theft:

- When installing a new tank, place it in a well-lit area but if the tank is in a secluded spot then don't light the area, as this will help the thief.
- Trellis, fencing and planting can be used to hide your tank, however make sure you leave a gap around the tank to avoid a fire risk. Check with your oil provider for details.
- Consider using a padlock to lock the cap. However be aware that you could risk having your tank pierced to get to your fuel, causing permanent damage and contamination from leaking oil. In addition to locks the installation of a tank alarm should be considered. These are triggered by movement or a sudden drop in level and many come with a high pitched siren and auto dialling facility to your smart phone.
- You could enclose your tank in a building. However it is important to provide good ventilation; advice should be sought from a professional.
- Make sure your perimeter fence is in good condition and is not easy to climb. Lock and secure gates.
- Check your oil gauges regularly. This will show any thefts and help investigations by narrowing crime times down.
