

## A LETTER FROM THE ARCHDEACON

Dear readers,

I've been asked to write this letter as your archdeacon. I'm Archdeacon Jeanette, archdeacon of Suffolk. The archdeaconry isn't actually the whole of Suffolk but covers the eastern side of the county including the Orebeck benefice (but excluding Ipswich which has its own archdeacon!).

Firstly, I want to say how encouraged I am at the enthusiasm and commitment I sense in the parishes to keep things going in the vacancy. Thank you to all those who are enabling this to happen. The new joint magazine is one example, another is the forward-planning of the service rota and I am looking forward to being with you on 4<sup>th</sup> September in Parham and on Christmas Day at Kettleburgh. Sharing worship with different people in our churches is always a privilege.

As I write, you are working with the Rural Dean, Revd Chris Davey, on your benefice profile which is the key document for potential applicants as together we seek to find a new priest in charge. Your hopes and vision for the future as well as your honest assessment of the challenges all help to build a picture for any incoming priest. We know that there are challenges, but there are also 'green shoots', new possibilities and ways of helping people to engage with faith and God, and it's these that I know you will seek to grow in the coming months. I hope that we can move forward to advertising in the autumn. Please pray for all those involved and for those whom God might be calling to serve amongst you.

It's easy to say 'please pray' – harder, perhaps, to actually make time and space to do it. Prayer is that attitude of constant dependence on and awareness of God's guiding and the wisdom of the Holy Spirit. It's the life-blood of a Christian. So whatever lies ahead for you, for the parishes, for our country and the world, please pray. And remember Philippians 4:6: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." You might also like to read verse seven! In God we trust.




### New to the Village?



## QUEENS PLATINUM JUBILEE VILLAGE EVENTS



# NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH



**With many of us already looking for 2023 holidays some advice from The Consumer Association:**

## **How to spot a holiday scam**

From fake accommodation listings to dodgy reviews, here are our top tips to spotting the signs that a holiday offer is too good to be true.

### **1. Incredibly cheap online deal?**

If the price for your flight or holiday is considerably cheaper than the average cost elsewhere, you should be suspicious.

Flight prices are largely set by airlines – with travel agents having some leeway – so, charging significantly less is often a sign that there may be a scammer behind the offer.

### **2. Look out for logos**

Looking out for official logos is a good way to check the authenticity of holiday booking, travel agent and tour operators.

Seeing the Atol logo in your travel company's brochures, adverts and websites should mean your holiday will be protected.

You can use the Check an Atol facility on the CAA website to check the Atol details of your travel company and the authenticity of any claims it's making.

If you have booked a holiday and have been assured you are Atol protected, make sure you are also given an Atol Certificate and know for sure that your holiday is Atol protected. The law says you should be given this certificate as soon as you have booked and paid money.

You can also look out for any logos that the travel agent or tour operator is a member of a recognised trade body such as ABTA.

This will also help you to identify if the company is legitimate.

If the company is a member of a recognised travel authority, you will have better financial protection and access to a complaints service should something go wrong.

If you're unsure, you can go on the ABTA website and verify the membership of the travel company.



### **3. Watch out for fake listings**

Popular holiday booking websites such as Airbnb and Holiday Lettings are a great place to find accommodation at a reasonable price.

Most listings are genuine, but scammers have figured out that they can use the popularity of these sites to dupe people and make some quick cash.

Scammers use these sites to set up fake listings with enticing deals for swanky getaways. A key tactic to look out for is that they will often try to get you to pay for your stay outside of the official website. Avoid any listing that asks you to pay by bank transfer or outside the internal system.

Don't be tempted to follow a web link that arrives in an email, however good it looks. If you're prompted in an email to log in to your profile, go to the official site and do it from there.

If the email is genuine, the same message will be there. If you're already logged in and the message you received isn't on the internal system, then it's probably a scammer.

Before you book, sites such as Airbnb and Holiday Lettings ban direct contact outside of their mail system to deter fraudsters. So, if you see a listing with the host's email or phone name, be very suspicious.

### **4. Bank transfer the only option?**

If a bank transfer is your only option for payment, this should set alarm bells ringing. You should be especially cautious if you're asked to pay directly into a private individual's bank account. Not only does this show no bank is prepared to provide credit card facilities, but – if you're dealing with a scammer – it will be almost impossible to get your money back.

Paying by direct bank transfer means your money will be very difficult to trace should something go wrong and is not refundable. Wherever possible, pay by credit card or a debit card. If you feel confident it's not a scammer and you're willing to make payment to the individual, make sure you use a secure payment site like PayPal.

If you're on holiday booking sites such as Airbnb or Holiday Lettings, you should never pay by bank transfer. Always use the internal site system to pay.

### **5. Check online reviews**

Do a thorough search to check the company's credentials. Check multiple reviews for information on other people's experiences and take note of any warnings about the company.

If a company is defrauding people, there's a good chance you will find out pretty quickly by reading several reviews.

Make sure you check several online review sites before booking and don't just rely on one. There's a chance the scammer could have posted



## **Fraudsters are posing as the energy regulator Ofgem to dupe people into handing over personal and payment details.**

*In May this year The Consumer Association issued a warning regarding telephone calls asking for bank details so that energy rebates could be paid. A further warning has been issued regarding email contact.*

Emails using the Ofgem logo and branding claim to offer an 'energy bill rebate scheme', directing recipients to a fake online portal. There, victims are urged to share personal and payment details in order to claim their refund.

The deceptive emails inform you that you can 'get your rebate via the Ofgem portal' by clicking a link that takes you to a fake site. Capitalising on the government's cost of living energy measures, the email explains that you claim a £200 discount on energy bills this Autumn and a £500 Council Tax Rebate. While this email appears to come from Ofgem, if you examine the sender's email you can see that the address has been spoofed.

The link in the email directs you to a fake portal to harvest your details. On arriving at the fake site, victims are confronted with a webform in order to 'set up a direct debit', which initially requests your full name, date of birth and email address.

For the purposes of this investigation, Which filled in the webform using some false details and found we were further prompted to enter:

- address and postcode
- email address
- phone number
- mother's maiden name
- payment card details.

Anyone providing these details to the scam site is likely to find their card fraudulently debited and would also be at grave risk of their identity and online accounts being taken over. Don't be tempted to respond to these emails.





The Duchess made the residents move the shop to the rear of the building as she did not want to see villagers queuing up 'across the road'.


